



- rain occurs mainly in winter, with summer being generally dry

Malta... Prohibition of single use plastic







Malta... Recycling

Applies to:

- water and flavoured water
- carbonated and non-carbonated soft drinks
- ciders, beers, and malt beverages
- ready to drink coffee
- flavoured alcoholic beverages with an alcoholic content level which does not exceed 5%
- dilutables

Cans that are squashed or bottles that have their labels removed winot be eligible for recycling.
