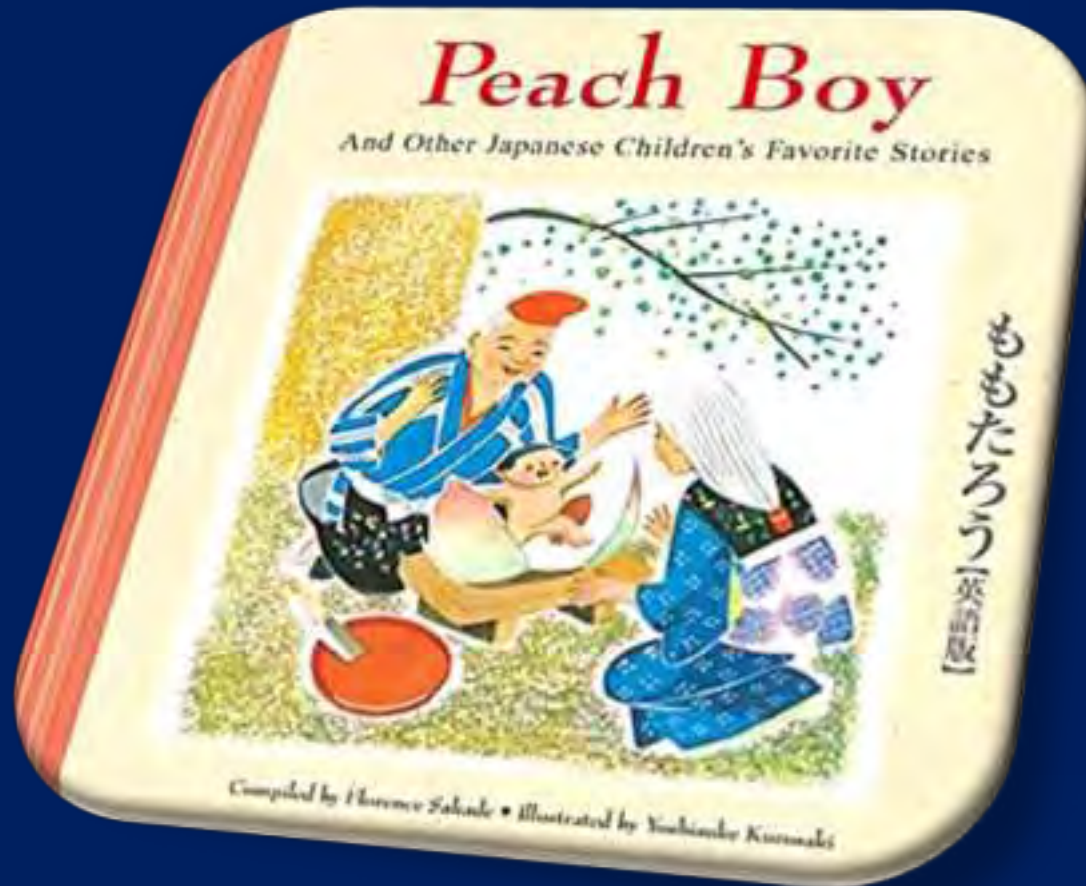

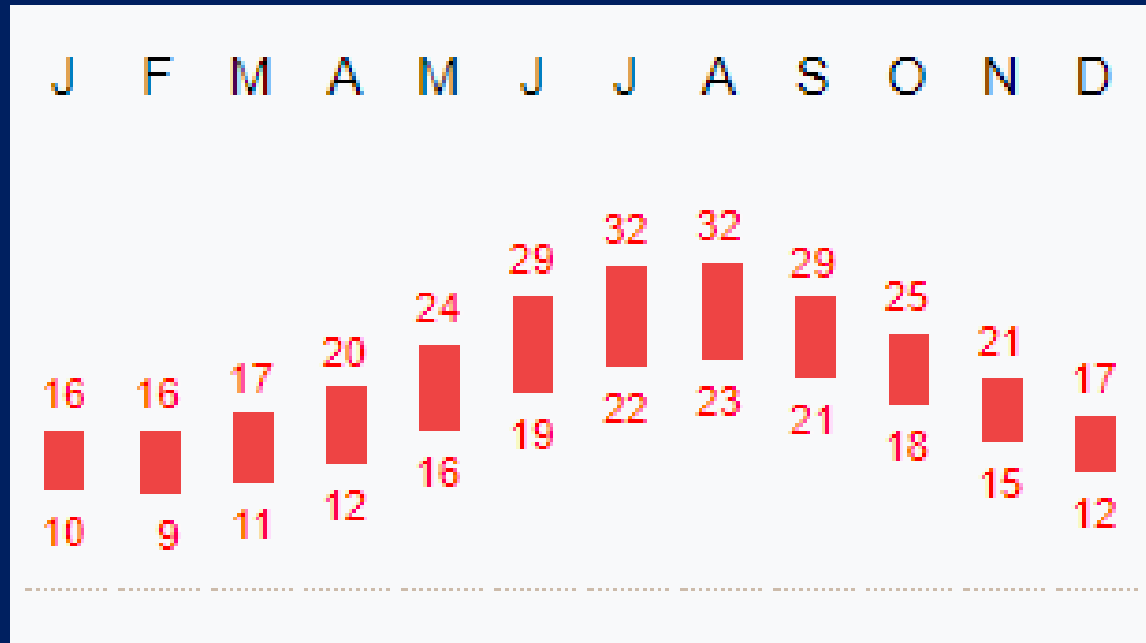

- Mediterranean climate
- very mild winters and warm to hot summers
- rain occurs mainly in winter, with summer being generally dry



Daylight

- Shortest day is 21 December
- Longest Day is 21 June

- Less Traffic, But Busier Tourist Areas
- Public Transport Adjustments
- No School or Government Services
- Community and Family Gatherings
- Religious and Cultural Celebrations - localised
- Feasts (Festas) with Fireworks - localised

Religious and Traditional Celebrations

- Good Friday & Easter Sunday (March/April, varies) - 18 and 20 April
- Village Feasts (Festas) (May–September)
- Carnival (February/March, before Lent) - February 28 to March 2

- Isle of MTV (Usually June/July)
- Malta Jazz Festival (July)
- Notte Bianca (October)

- Malta International Airshow (September) - 27 and 28 September
- Malta Marathon (February/March) - 23 February

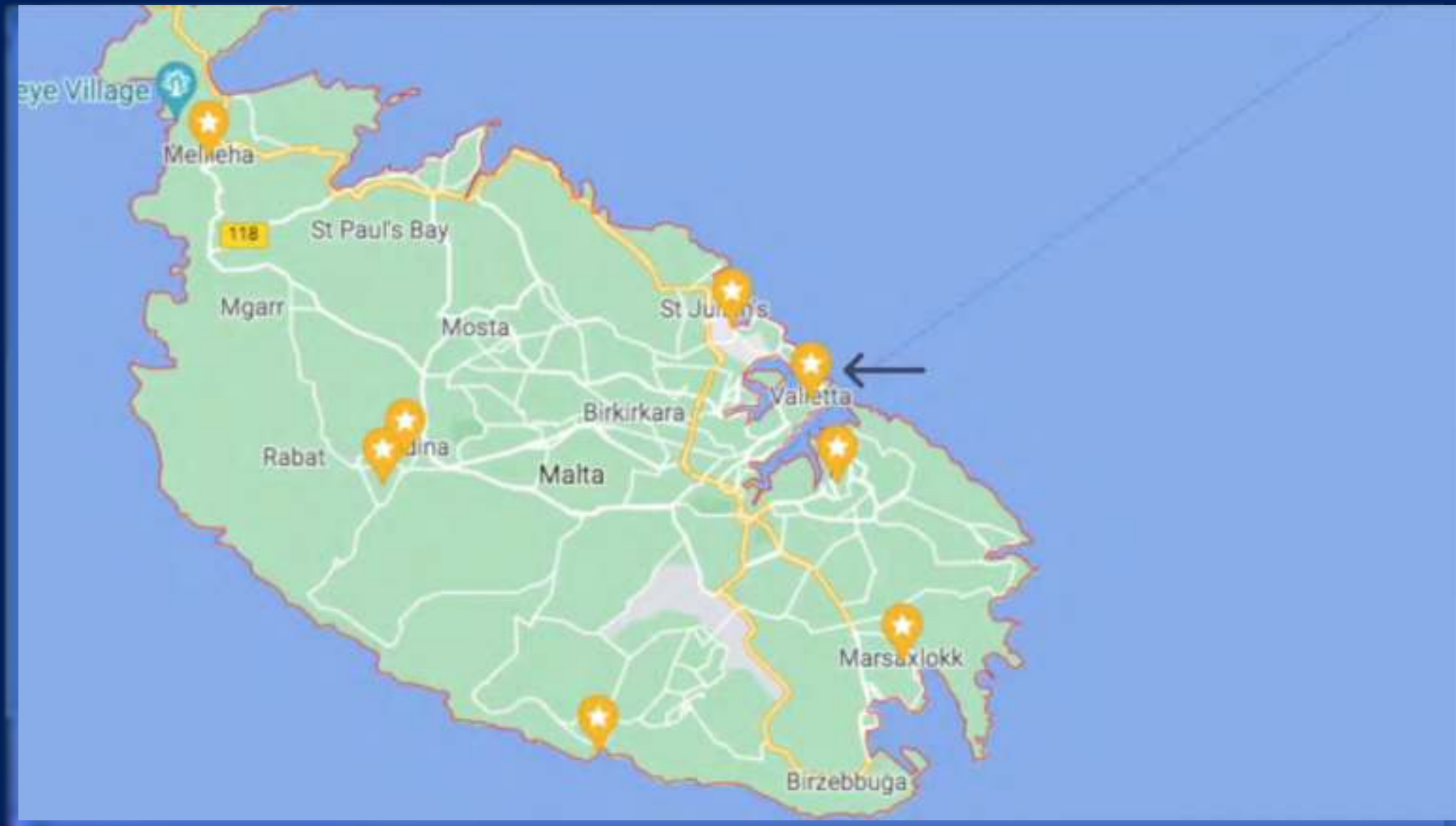

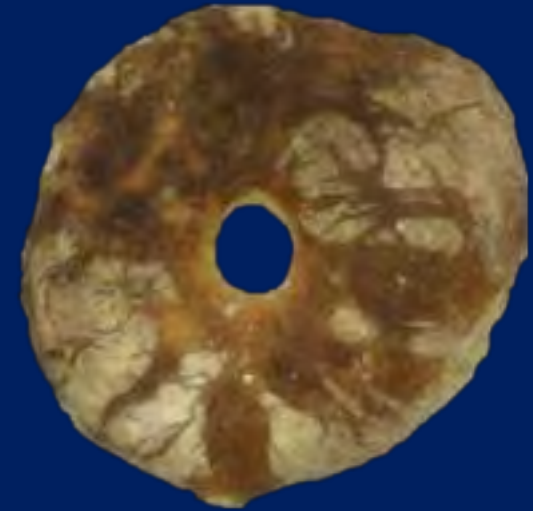

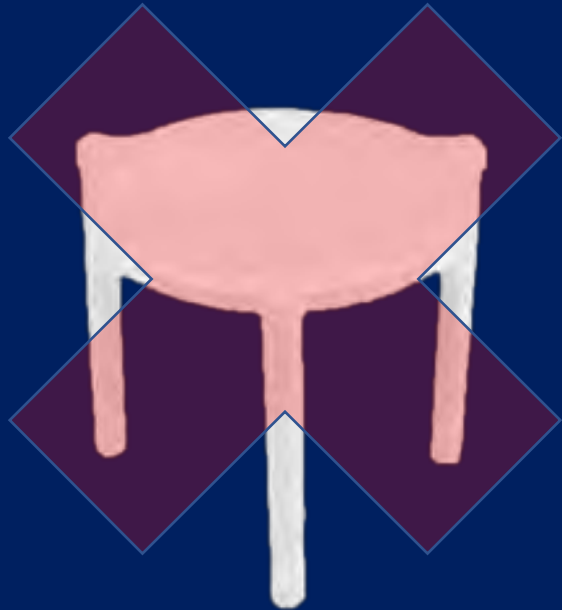

Malta... Prohibition of single use plastic



Malta... Recycling

Applies to:

- water and flavoured water
- carbonated and non-carbonated soft drinks
- ciders, beers, and malt beverages
- ready to drink coffee
- flavoured alcoholic beverages with an alcoholic content level which does not exceed 5%
- dilutables



Cans that are squashed or bottles that have their labels removed will not be eligible for recycling.
